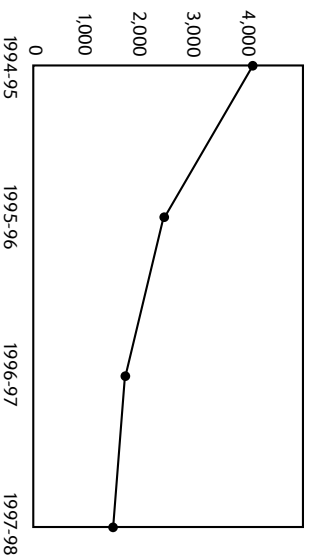

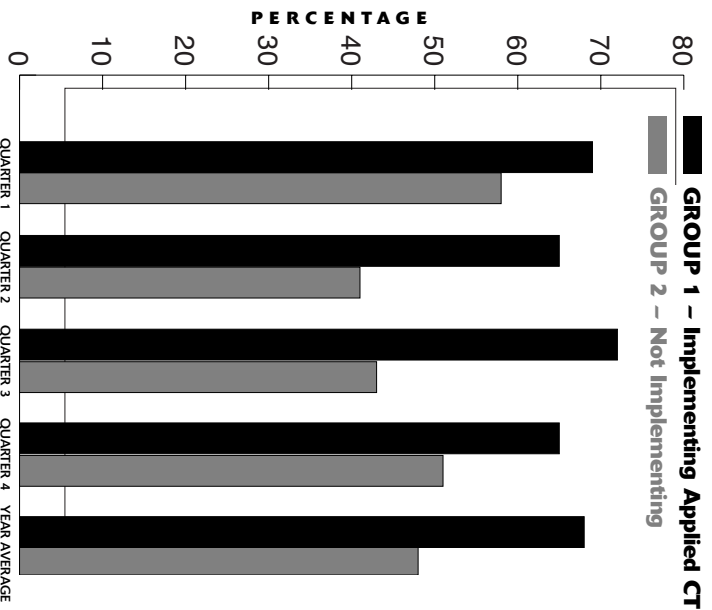

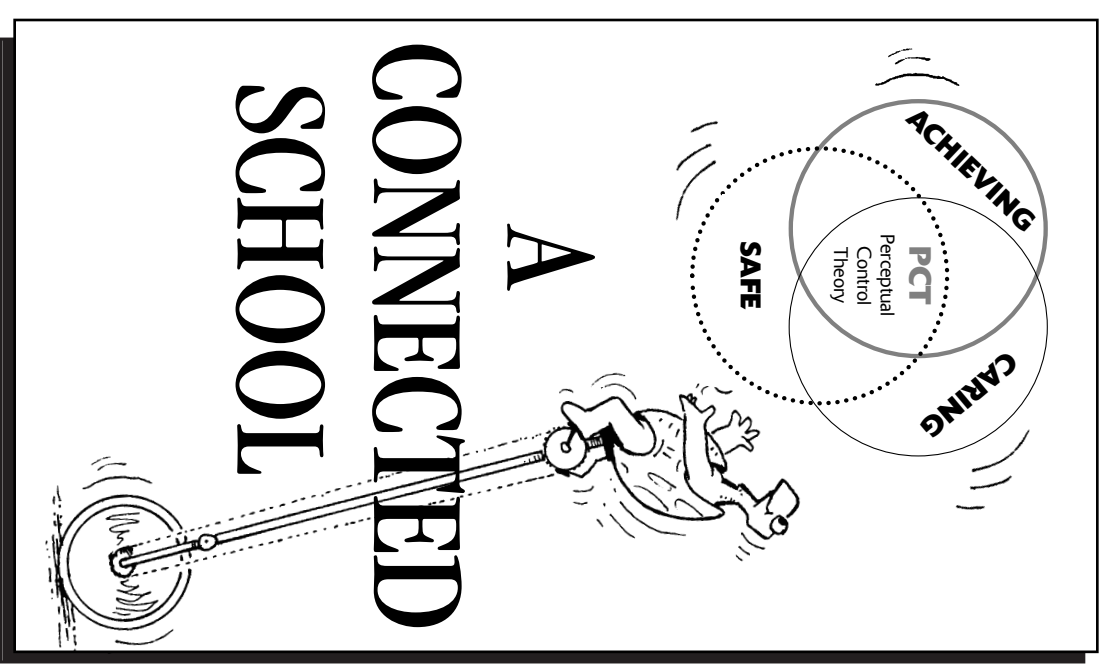
**DISCIPLINE**

Students who feel connected ...

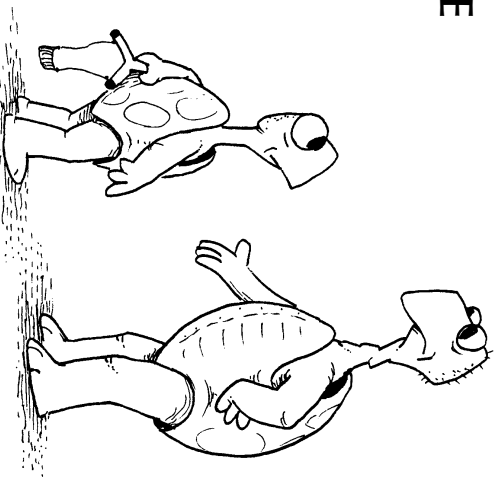
- are less likely to use alcohol and illegal drugs
